Our annual general meeting was February 7, 2013. We welcome new executive, and also those returning for another year.



NEW! Small Bore Sunday Fun Shoots

Starting in March (**Sunday March 3**rd) we are organizing a low cost club only games shoot on the first Sunday of each month from March to November. The .22 and .17 rimfires are fun and inexpensive to shoot and are the ultimate practice rifles to keep sharp for hunting season. We now have 12 portable target stands for the small bore and Junior shooters to use.



There are a lot of club members who own rimfires. Club members and their guests are welcome. It is OK to bring any rimfire rifle to shoot. This is a good opportunity to meet other club members and see a variety of different rifles and compare how well they shoot. These shoots don't require the costly equipment of some of the other shooting matches. It is a good place to start out and see if you like the shooting sports, or for new shooters to learn.

The Club will supply use of the 100 and 50 yard ranges, targets and portable target stands. Volunteer members (needed) will score and track the targets shot in each match. We plan to use the 100 range for club completions, games and practice. The 50 yard and indoor ranges, targets and stands will be available for practice shooting and instruction. *The club has several .22 rifles available if you do not have your own.*

Changes in Junior Hunter ages. The Junior Hunter licensing age has changed to 10 - 17 years old in an effort to encourage youth hunters. For more information go to the Ministry of Environment website or **HERE**

Initiation Hunters License. Again in effort to encourage new hunter the Ministry of Environment has developed an Initiation License for those who wish to try hunting. This is a one time only license valid for one year and available to those 18 or over that have never held an adult hunting license. As in the case of the Junior License the holder will not have his/her own tags, and must be accompanied by a mentor who is 18 or over and who has held a full license for at least 3 full years prior to the current license year, and who is not prohibited from carrying or possessing firearms. A mentor may accompany up to two initiation licensed hunters at one time. For full information initiation licenses CLICK HERE

Halibut There are new regulations for recreational halibut fishing. <u>CLICK HERE</u> For Fisheries and Oceans Canada.

Limits and sizes: Effective 00:01 hours March 15 to 23:59 hours March 31, 2013, the daily limit for halibut is one (1) and the possession limit for halibut is two (2), of which only one may be greater than 83cm.

Effective 00:01 hours April 1, 2013 until further notice: -

The maximum length for halibut is 126cm. (49.6063 inches)

The daily limit for halibut is one (1).


The possession limit for halibut is two (2), only one of which may be greater than 83cm in length. (32.6772 inches)

There will be an annual limit of six (6) halibut (per licence holder).

All halibut retained by the licence holder shall be immediately recorded in ink on the Tidal Waters Sport Fishing licence. The area from which each halibut is caught and its length shall immediately be recorded on license.
